



Parent Teacher Meetings


Nov.22nd + 23rd for 1st to 6th class

Did you know?

You don't need to rake up fallen leaves from your lawns. The layer of leaves provides shelter and food to insects & earthworms which in turn provides larger mammals and birds with an important source of food over the winter months. If you must rake leaves, put them on your compost heap or place them on flower beds and at the base of trees and plants around your garden. This will enable leaves to return their nutrients right to the roots of these plants.
